## Working to Reduce Parental Conflict in Surrey Guest entry from Sue Turton – Early Help & Partnerships Service Manager

As the lead for the Early Help Partnerships Service in Surrey our team aim to support you with what is a growing concern for professionals working with Surrey Families. We would like to welcome you to our first Newsletter for the Reducing parenting Conflict (RPC) work happening in Surrey. We hope you find this a helpful resource which outlines the aims for this work and all the latest updates and news about events in one place.

Surrey's aims are to reduce the impact of parental conflict on children and for reducing parental conflict (RPC) to become part of everyday practice for professionals, growing alongside the use of RPC tools into an approach that will help support families to build positive relationships in every aspect of their lives. We believe that by embedding both support and resources for RPC into local services we can help families to develop, progress and thrive

How are we going to do this?

Our Phase 3 plan begins with working with our stakeholder group to help us expand on our RPC offer. We plan to link in with the Better Start strategy, joining the dots with the work on parental relationships, particularly work with fathers, the importance of healthy relationships and how they can impact young children. We are also planning on linking in with the Early Help Strategy to embed RPC into practice and further build upon the evidence base for what works to reduce parental conflict and improve outcomes for children.

We will also continue to deliver on the work which has been ongoing throughout our previous funding phases. With particular focus on be raising awareness, training the workforce, creating pathways to support, and embedding evidenced based interventions.

## **RPC Digital Resources Update**

During the last funding phase, we received a lot of feedback for both the One Plus One online tools and the Between Us App regarding the difficulties faced by both parents and practitioners in gaining access to the resources.

We have worked with both providers in this funding phase to provide a more streamlined process which can provide access for a greater number of parents and practitioners.

#### **Tavistock Between Us Updates:**

1. Previously a trained practitioner was required to refer parents to the Between Us App. However, we have agreed with Tavistock that the Between Us App can now be referred to by any service/practitioner within Surrey and accessed universally by any parent within Surrey.

2. Licences will no longer be required to be issued by a practitioner or centre to parents. Instead, parents can request access to the Between Us Ap directly from the below link:

#### One Plus One Updates:

 Previously a trained practitioner was required to refer parents to the One Plus One digital resources. However, we have agreed with One Plus One that the digital resources can now be referred to by any service/practitioner within Surrey and accessed universally by any parent within Surrey.

#### Tavistock: Between Us App overview

Between Us is an app designed to help parents have a better relationship with their partner now or in the future. It was created by Tavistock Relationships, an organisation based in London, which has been helping couples for more than 70 years. The app provides individuals and couples with: A range of exercises, Tips, Videos and Information. The app allows you to better understand what's going wrong in your relationship and do something about it.

One of the ways in which the app works is by helping partners in a relationship to reflect together, and more constructively, on their difficulties. A number of the topics on the app ask the user a short series of questions, about themselves, and then also about their partner.

Surrey have purchased licences for parents and practitioners to have access to the Tavistock Between us App which has been designed to help people have a better relationship with their partner. The app provides individuals and couples with a range of exercises, tips, videos and information so that they can better understand what's going wrong in their relationship and do something about it.

#### One Plus One: Overview

Surrey have purchased access to three online resources that have been developed by One Plus One to help parents understand the impact of their arguments on their children, and learn techniques to communicate better, handle stress, and manage conflict more constructive. The three resources are:

- Me, You and Baby Too
- · Arguing better
- Getting it Right for Children

One plus One combine the online recourses with a training programme for those practitioners working to support families, which offers a toolkit of support that empowers people with the skills and confidence they need to do things differently. The sessions aim to enhance practitioner knowledge, understanding, skills, and confidence to work with parents. By the end of the training practitioners will be able to:

- Raise parents' awareness of the issue of parental conflict.
- Use digital resources to help parents recognise conflict.
- Enable parents to develop positive communication skills and helpful conflict behaviours.

If you have forgotten your password there is an option to reset this on the login page. Please be aware that although the videos play in here, nothing interactive will work and are just there for illustrative purposes.

This is the link you need to give parents so that they can access the three digital courses (Me, You and Baby Too, Getting it Right for Children, and Arguing Better). Each parent will need to select Surrey from the Southern England map and then create themselves an account as per the instructions given.

Note: If for any reason a parent is unable to log in with their own account, you can create one for them. However, please be aware that if they don't have their own unique login, we may not have enough data on our quarterly reports to show how many parents are logging in to the system etc. If parents are separated, they may wish to create two logins.
