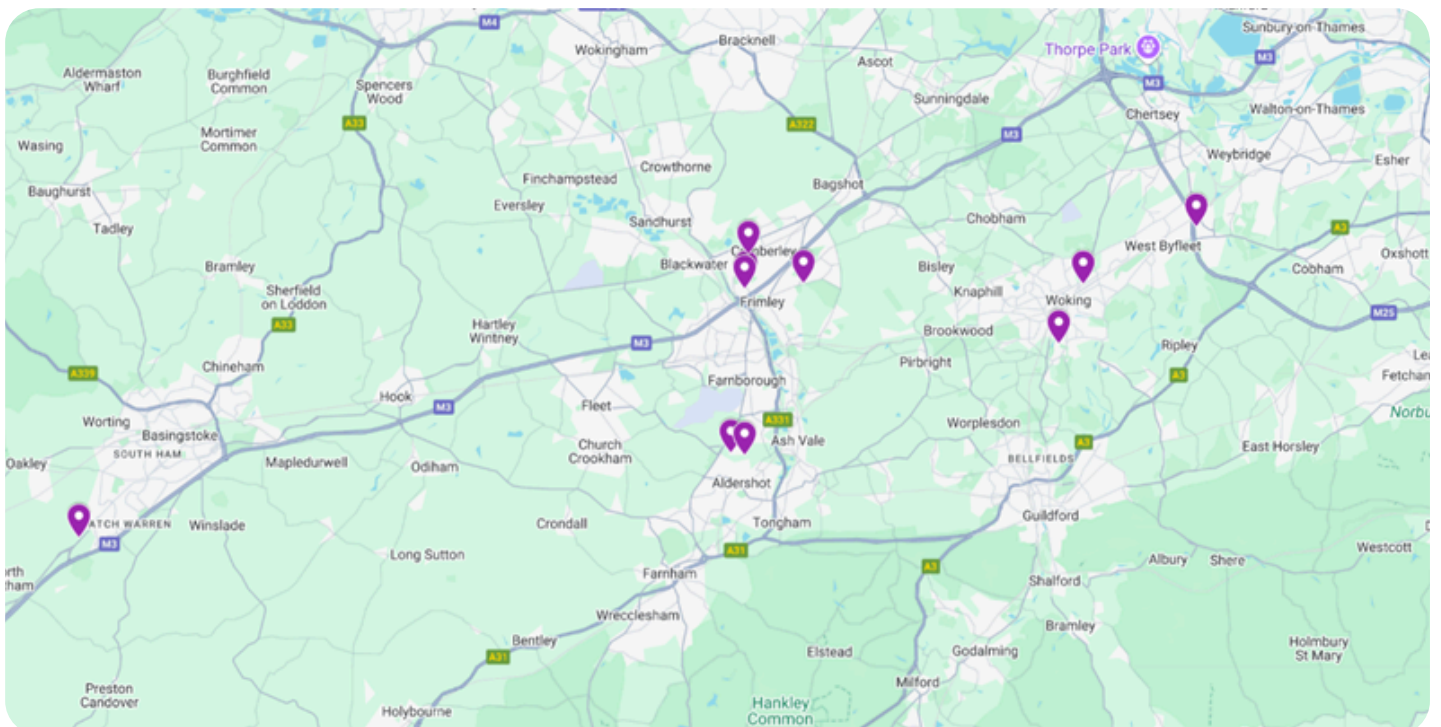
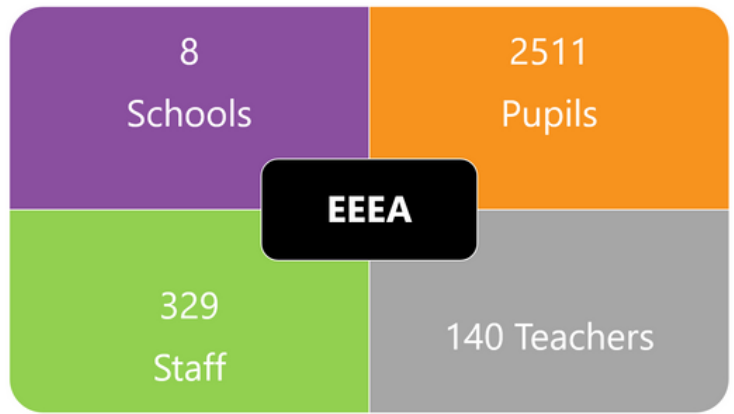

# SCHOOL NEWS



## Byfleet Primary School



This term, Byfleet pupils have been taking their learning into the local community. Year 1 enjoyed an inspiring visit to the Lightbox gallery in Woking, where they were praised for their excellent behaviour and enthusiasm. They designed sculptures that represented themselves and their communities, linking closely with their art and design curriculum. Year 2 continued the local learning theme with a trip to Byfleet Fire Station, the oldest in Britain, where they learned about the history and development of the fire service. They also visited the local library and St Mary's Church, making it a very full day for everyone.

Higher up the school, Year 6 impressed with a thoughtful class assembly about the changes of the Edwardian era, including the construction of the Brooklands track. Pupils across the school have enjoyed recognising their learning within their own community.

## The Cambridge Primary School

This term has been exceptionally busy and rewarding for our Cambridge community, filled with memorable learning experiences and strong examples of our school values in action.

Year 6 began the term with a week-long residential at PGL Liddington, which offered teamwork, outdoor challenges and opportunities for personal growth. The trip helped pupils bond as a cohort and build the confidence and independence they will need for secondary school. Year 2 enjoyed an inspiring visit to Windsor Castle where they explored the history of the British monarchy and the grandeur of this working royal palace.

## Chair of Trustees – Stephen Norton

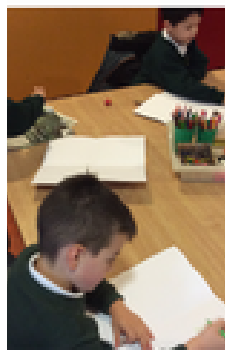
