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## PARENT FORUM 22.5.2019

Mrs Brady introduced our new Behaviour Policy which is available for parents to look at on our website [here](#). Please see the PowerPoint presentation [here](#).

Behaviour Reflection Sheets - if a child is required to complete three in the course of one week, parents will be contacted. It is possible that we would speak to a parent at the end of the school day prior to this.

The fact that the language in the policy is very grown up was questioned. However, children will be taught in school about the policy so that they understand it.

Staff are receiving lots of behaviour training.

Positive postcards are being made which will be sent home to acknowledge good behaviour and we are also looking at sending positive texts to parents. The emphasis is changing to ensure we recognise children who make the right choices. House points will remain as a reward.

'Funky Fridays' begin on 24<sup>th</sup> May when children will have speaker systems with music for fun at lunch times at all campuses.

School lunches will be reviewed with a view to creating a 'dining experience' for the children; School Council will be having a trial school lunch.

Staff are receiving training on our new maths programme 'Maths No Problem' on 23<sup>rd</sup>/24<sup>th</sup> May.

We are doing lots of recruiting and new teachers will be in school on transition day, Wednesday 3<sup>rd</sup> July.

We will be introducing French into Year 2 from September.

Jonny Franks, our new Assistant Head Teacher with a focus on inclusion, encompassing special needs, English as an additional language, pupil premium and support staff, starts after half term.

We will be looking at training staff in specific areas.

We also have a maths specialist starting in September, Seb Munns.

There will be more teachers next year and less support staff.

The change to after school care was due to financial reasons; it will be reviewed again. We have introduced more free clubs and they will continue next year.

We are finding that some parents are not paying for school trips. The school needs to get in at least 80% of the cost which is why we are running cake sales to make up some of the money. We are trying to plan trips for a whole year in advance to give parents plenty of notice.
